Dr. Ferrell is professor of clinical medicine in the Department of Medicine and Division of Geriatrics at the UCLA David Geffen School of Medicine. He acts as the director of palliative care services for both the Ronald Reagan UCLA Medical Center in Westwood, Calif. and the UCLA Santa Monica Medical Center and Orthopedic Hospital in Santa Monica, Calif. He has held a UCLA faculty appointment for nearly 20 years and is the associate chief for education in the Division of Geriatrics.

In 2005, Dr. Ferrell was awarded the David Geffen School of Medicine Award for Excellence in Education. He is a Fellow of the American College of Physicians (FACP), a Fellow of the American Geriatrics Society (AGS) and a member of the American Academy of Hospice and Palliative Care.

Dr. Ferrell's scholarly interest is applied clinical research and he is a recognized national and international leader in the area of persistent pain in older persons. He has conducted studies, authored numerous publications and was chair of the AGS's expert panel on persistent pain in older persons. He also serves as the editor in chief of Belvoir Publication's monthly newsletter titled 'UCLA Healthy Years.'

Dr. Ferrell obtained his medical degree and completed his residency in internal medicine at the University of Oklahoma. He then went on to complete subspecialty training in geriatric medicine at UCLA.
