Dr. Gharibo is the Medical Director of Pain Medicine in the Department of Anesthesiology at NYU Hospital for Joint Diseases. He is an Assistant Professor of Anesthesiology at NYU School of Medicine and maintains a full time pain medical practice at NYU. Before joining NYU, Dr. Gharibo was the Director of the Bellevue Pain Treatment Center for five years.

He obtained his medical degree from New Jersey Medical School in 1992 and completed his anesthesiology residency at NYU Medical Center. He served his Pain Medicine fellowship at Thomas Jefferson University Hospital in Philadelphia. He is a Diplomate of the American Board of Anesthesiology and American Board of Pain Medicine and holds Special Qualifications in Pain Medicine.

His areas of clinical expertise include low back and neck pain of musculoskeletal and spinal origin, cancer pain, and neuropathic pain syndromes such as painful peripheral neuropathies, reflex sympathetic dystrophy and many other chronic pain conditions. He holds particular pharmacological and clinical experience in acute and perioperative pain management.

Dr. Gharibo has published multiple abstracts, articles and chapters in his field. He has been invited to speak at many conferences in the United States and overseas. He is a member of the American Pain Society, American Society of Regional Anesthesia, International Anesthesia Research Society and American Society of Anesthesiologists.
